#### **Quinte Amateur Radio Club Minutes**

The April regular monthly meeting of the Quinte Amateur Radio Club was replaced by another amateur radio auction, similar to last year. Members from four Clubs were represented at this year's auction - The Price Edward Radio Club, The Trenton Radio Club, the Tri-County Radio Club and the Quinte Amateur Radio Club. The auction started about 7:35pm. This year the auctioneer was Peter VE3KWM who did a very fine business job for his very first time. (Peter it is "ok" to quit your day job, hi hi). The bidding rules were the same as last year with the bids started at 50 cents and going up in increments of 50 cents, unless there was a reserve bid. All in attendance enjoyed a funfilled evening and there were many bargooons! A member from each club recorded the auction transactions that amounted to several hundreds of dollars in total!! If you are looking for best and most inexpensive flee market auction, this was it. Just wait 'till next year, if you could wait that long! Some of this year's stuff may come back again next year, hi hi.

The auction lasted about two hours and concluded at about 9:30 pm.

### **RAC 2003 Annual Board Meeting**

As Radio Amateurs of Canada marked it's Tenth Anniversary, Directors and Executive recently attended the RAC 2003 Annual Board Meeting held at the NavCanada Training and Conference Centre in Cornwall. The agenda included final approval of a corporate business plan and budgeting for

- (1) An improved RAC Internet Services Management structure,
- (2) A 2003-2004 RAC Membership Recruitment and Retention Campaign.
- (3) A RAC Youth Education Program.

Following the Board Meeting, RAC's 2003 Annual General Meeting of members convened. In addition to financial statements and audit reports, the President's narrative report to members was presented. Members were provided an opportunity to ask questions and express concerns. ARRL President Jim Haynie, W5JBP was a welcome participant at both meetings. IARU President Larry Price, W4RA and RAC VP for Government and International Affairs, Ken Pulfer, VE3PU, extensively outlined the preparations leading up to WRC-2003. It was the first occasion on whichan IARU President was in attendance at RAC Annual Meetings. Minutes and reports of both meetings will appear in The Canadian Amateur and on the RAC Website.

#### Radio Course

Over the past few months there has been a few requests for information on how to get an amateur radio licence. QARC has not had a radio course in about five years.
