The radio club had 12 members assisting along the route for the 5 and 10 K MS walk.

George VE3YD and Ron VE3IVC were at the Base station located in the front hall of Moira Sec School. We used a 440 link to QAR set up in Dave's (VE3UGT) in his truck and a 440 handheld in the school. Nice and compact.

Tim VE3UO was mobile driving around the routes. Peter VE3UR was located at Check point 1, a 5 and 10 k check, at St Michaels School. Mike VE3VMP was at Check point 2 on the Bay Shore in the10 K section of the walk. DaveVE3UGT, Bob VE3QWB, Keith VA3KRV, Hermann VA3VHH, Bill VA3WOW, Glen VE3CJG and Doug VE3ZDG, were located along the route to pass on any messages for help to the base station if necessary.
